## 1. Purpose

Questions to consider:



The construct: What CAPS skills or topics does this assessment assess?

The end use: What do I need these results for?

Best tool: Is this the best tool to assess these skills/ topics?

## 2. Validity

Questions to consider:



Does the assessment test the purpose?

Does the assessment match the required cognitive levels?

Which external factors will influence the results?

Questions to consider:

Are there questions where wording is problematic?



Is all of the vocabulary used, accessible to learners?

Are questions too wordy?
